June 17, 2023

Meeting called to order at 7:00 by President Norman Brown. Led in prayer by Pastor Keith.

Also present were Memorial Officer Margaret Brust, Financial Secretary Sandy Ried, Board of Christian Education President Denise Valenzuela, Spiritual Council President and Buildings and Grounds Leader Michael Wieckhorst, Spiritual Council Members Cindy Kriefels, Nick Brown and Sherry Smith. Church member Nancy Hunt also attended.

Motion to approve agenda was made by Richard and seconded by Larry, passed.

Member comment time. Michael expressed concern over the recent Congregational Meeting and lack of organization. The volunteer's fulling the Custodial role are dwelling in members and wishes the Council consider filling that role with a paid person.

Nancy presented the June minutes, motion to accept minutes made by Jason, seconded by Josh, passed.

Financial Report presented by Sandy. We are in the Green for the month of June but not for the year. See attached report. The deductible for the roof damage is \$2500 and we have Memorials and money in a CD that can help cover that if needed. Sandy will be missing several Sundays in August and will need assistance to cover her duties.

Pastors Report given by Pastor Keith.

Jen gave Secretary Report. See attached. Norm thanked her for all the work she has done on our Facebook account and with the Website proposal.

Margaret reported that \$200 was received this month. Total in account is \$89,363.36. CDs amounts are unchanged and can be found in the Annual Report.

The Spiritual Council report given by Michael Wieckhorst. They have spent many hours working to resolve conflicts in the Church. Not many have been attending the Saturday evening service. We as Church members need to attend/promote it more and feel it should continue into the fall to see if the attendance improves. Pastor Curtis will be pulpit supply in Sunday July 23. The options for pulpit supply and organist are critically low. If there are any ideas on people that can be contacted on an "as needed basis", contact Mike.

Denise gave a Board of Christian Education report. Lily Graham has accepted to complete the empty seat on the board. They are planning having a "5<sup>th</sup> Quarter" get together after home football games, including food and activities. First game is September 1. Will be contacting the school to assist in the promotion. If well attended, will consider having after other events also. Richard has planned an Adult Sunday School Class. Nick will be working with the board in development of the music program for next year.

Building and Grounds Report from Michael reported that the tree on the east side of the church has been removed. Cost \$3,000. By counting the rings, it was about 95 years old. Will be looking into stump removal. Can do it ourselves, it will take years to complete. The insurance summery on the hail damage was presented and discussed. Mike has some questions and has been working to clarify a few items. The steeple was also damaged and investigating options on repair for the insurance company to review. The North Sunday School room sustained water damage after the storm. Mike and Dale cleaned it up and found is a crack in the concrete wall that will need repaired and many Sunday School supplies will need to be replaced. Denise will try to get a list of supplies needed so we can get replacements before September. A proposal for replacing the North door was presented from AA windows. They did the South doors and will be able to match the North doors. The total estimate cost is \$8872.46. This bid is good until January.

F team report from Mike included July event. It was well attended, especially considering the rain delay. Pam Epp will be taking the lead on the Turkey Trot planned for the fall.

Old Business

Church Security - Jason reported he is continuing to investigate options for recording cameras. He's working with members to develop a security team.

Job Descriptions – The Job Descriptions for Financial Secretary and Choir Director were tabled by motion of Brian and a second by Larry.

Social Media Update – With the updated Web Site proposal being increased to \$4,460, it was felt we should approve the additional amount. Larry moved and Richard seconded to approve the current bid. Passed. Proposal will be voted on next 3

Sunday, since there was a lack of a quorum last Sunday. If not approved, we will still need to have Rob Huff clean up our Facebook accounts.





# "As For Me And My House, We Will Serve the L-rd"

# (Joshua 24:15b)

These were words that Joshua, son of Nun said to Israel shortly before he passed.

Was it easy for England? Absolutely not! The British people dug in, worked together and fended off the onslaught brought on by the Third Reich.

Only by standing up for something you firmly believe in will prevail. It might cost you dearly. You may even lose your life.

Christ lost His because he believed YOU were worth it. Praise the L-rd that He rose again on the third day! He is the firstfruit of the resurrection!

Those of us who believe and earnestly follow Him will be resurrected as well. (1 Corinthians 15:20-23)

Stand up for your faith. Defend it. Stand on G-d's word and NEVER doubt it, nor be ashamed of it. (Romans 1:16)
